




Bridge Program Strategy

- Shifted the "Case Work" to Counselors in 9 Schools
 - 3 Junior High Schools
 - 3 High Schools
 - 3 Alternative Schools
- Sent 52 "briefs" to School Counselors to Continue Counseling and Support Services
- Maintaining the Summer Program Committee to:
 - Continue program support
 - Continue to improve agency communication and coordination
 - Monitor progress, identify and support needs
 - Collect Pre and Post 2007-08 and 2008-09 education data for 52 ongoing students to measure results
 - Collaborate with the Long Term Strategy Committee

Long Term Plan - GOALS

- Build on the Summer Program Model
- Establish clear differentiation between policy and operational roles and responsibilities
- Focus on institutionalizing a coordination strategy and not operating programs
- Create a South Coast structure with potential for Countywide expansion

South Coast Gang Task Force

EXECUTIVE COUNCIL

- South Coast Chief Executives
 - (Sheriff, Chief of Police, UCSB, SBCC, Business, Fighting Back, All for One, CAC, SB Foundation, Probation, Social Services, two School Superintendents, and four City/County Executives)
- Allocates resources, reduces bureaucracy and promotes coordination
- Hires/oversees the Executive Director -Coordinator
- Institutionalizes policies and programs

South Coast Gang Task Force

LEADERSHIP COUNCIL

 Community leaders and elected officials who commit their agencies or organizations to support a five-year pilot program

(Nine elected local government officials, two foundation officers, and one each representing families, youth, UCSB and faith community)

- Provides Policy Oversight
- Commits and secures resources
- Meets with Executive Council to measure progress/chart direction

South Coast Gang Task Force

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR/COORDINATOR

- Staff support to the Leadership/Executive Councils
- Identifies services/program gaps and facilitates organization linkages/coordination
- Implements strategies to accomplish goals and monitors youth gang program results
- Coordinates the development of grant proposals for public/private funds for youth gang programs
- Assists the Executive Council to procure, receive and distribute "partnership" and "pilot program" funds to youth gang program operators




