- Focus on hard core high risk youth, few are actually working with this population
- Research: Success based on relationships
- Dependable, long term funding streams

- Six organizations who have worked informally together for years to serve the hard core at risk youth.
- All are activity based services.
- Key to success is relationships with youth.

Funding/Staffing Challenges

Example: Primo Boxing

- \$40,000 Annual Budget
- 200 Students in program each year
- 1 full time employee
- 2 full time volunteers
- 11 part time volunteers

- To strengthen and formalize collaboration.
- We see our role important to the strategy.
- We can work together and share resources and information.
- Smaller organizations need help with administration.
- To I.D. service gaps and bring in or develop providers
